We have had a busy and exciting time and we are delighted to share some of the wonderful activities we have experienced with your children.

## *The power of language through stories, role play and songs*

At Burhani we understand that language is the foundation of all learning. Through stories role play and songs we provide an environment rich in language that nurtures communication skills imagination and emotional expression.

**Foundation 1** Pupils had exciting stories to the following topics: colors, farm and jungle animals and developing self-expression through creative activities



**Foundation two** have been following stories regarding the topics:

My self, transport, dark and light and growing plant.



Stories and role play help children to connect with the world around them, developing and extending their vocabulary. As they listen to stories, they engage in conversation and ask questions. Songs are an excellent way to support language development, rhythm and movement.

**Kg3** Through stories pupils have been developing curricular activities such as reading, writing and science. They have followed the topics: growing, healthy eating, living things and their habitat.



**Reading** has been our main focus throughout the nursery this term. The passion for reading can only be developed through regular and consistent sharing of books, talking about pictures, listening to stories, learning alphabets, letter sound and recognizing keywords.



Our new initiative of creating individual reading folder in kg3 has made a huge impact in children reading. Thank you to those parents who have supported their children with reading at home.

**Field trips** give your children a chance to explore the world outside the classroom. They help make learning fun and real by connecting it to what they see and experience in the world around them. Kg3 visited the market to learn about fruits and vegetables.



Foundation2 visited the airport following the topic on transport.



**Foundation1:** Colors in nature. It was fascinating to see young children looking around for different colors. Picking flowers, leaves and other natural materials and talking about them.



By exploring nature young children learn to appreciate the world around them and helps them to understand how to take care of the environment.

**Assemblies** have been our focus point to come together and learn about moral values, awareness of nature and celebration of festivals such as Eid and Easter.



**Physical activities.** Every learner in nursery has been taking part in physical activities and swimming lesson at least once a week.

Activities like running, jumping and playing games help learners to develop balance and strength while having fun and encouraging social interaction, listening and following instructions.



Numbers and solving simple problems help young children to develop thinking skills whether counting toys or solving puzzles. These skills are important in everyday life.

**Creative arts.** Children have been engaging in creative activities such as painting and other forms of artistic expressions.
